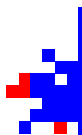

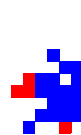
### CAMP RULES

NO campfires except in designated areas (if allowed)

 NO Smoking on facility  
 NO alcoholic beverages  
 NO generators  
 NO PETS  
 NO cutting of trees— Firewood is available free of charge  
 Must be one adult per scout to stay within BSA policy  
 Buddy system at all times!
